
We are so blessed by God's people no matter where they live or worship. We want to thank Faith Assembly of God in Cressona PA. This congregation has continued to bless us each month with their support.

There was a point before sobriety where I doubted myself, doubted where my life would take me, and doubted my faith. It was a bleak part of my life and a chapter that I wouldn't have had the courage to turn the page if it weren't for the blessings that God gave me and my family. He helped me see things in clarity and guided me every step of the way. If it weren't for Him, I wouldn't be where I am today.

Brian's Story

My name is Brian Wolfinbarger, I am 39 years old from eastern Kentucky originally. I have recently been married and have a newborn son. I started experimenting with drugs at the age of 15 and by my mid 20's I needed drugs daily. I have been to jail, treatments, and death. I am a miracle of God's grace. I have been in an out of recovery for 10 years, but it wasn't until June of 2018 when I came to a place where I felt the hand of God at work thru other people. The Way Home has helped the transformation process in many ways for me today. Whether the Bible studies, church services, one on one counseling, or the support of the churches they all played a role of who and where I am today. I am coming up on 365 days clean and sober by God's grace and mercy.

I have restored relationships today with parents and family. I have a fulltime job, a support group and a program I work, a car, and a checking account. But the greatest blessings I have been given are my wife Erica, son Lennon and step-daughter Paige. God has done for

I've since been sober just under 365 days—a miracle, and still a work-in-progress for me. I'm still working on myself and in retrospect, I think it's going to continue working for me, my Husband Brian, and our two children: Paige & Lennon, as long as we remember to support each other, turn over our problems to God, and allow room for growth by working on ourselves and working hard for our family.

Some days are trying, but because of my two children, Paige and Lennon, and my husband, Brian, it gives me more motivation to stay sober, it provides purpose, and more encouragement for me to keep a steadfast faith in God. Brian and I work really hard to make heads or tails of every situation and sometimes it's a struggle, but we're already fortunate and very grateful for the life that we're living now. Some days I look around, and I'm amazed at the opportunity that has been presented to me and my husband. This time last year I was sure that my chances at a content life were slim to none. We had exhausted every effort to get better. Our families, friends and even my daughter were exhausted. I'm forever grateful that Terry, and his partners saw something in us that we had forgotten a long time ago. Most importantly for God, and the presence of God in these people that granted us an opportunity of a lifetime, an opportunity to get our lives back.

Brian's Parents

Having to wait and see how that God was going to intervene in the life of our troubled son was gut wrenching. But looking back, we can see God all along the way intervening. Even in some of the worst of times, we saw the hand of God in mercy, working in the situations. Addiction had taken practically everything from our son, with only, by God's grace his life to cling to. As parents, exhausting every possible thing that we thought we could do, which most times only worsened it, we could only look to the Lord for deliverance.

Someone has said, "God never gets in a hurry, but God is never late." For us, we see God in His time working all things after the council of His own will, coming right on time in using the ministry of Transformed at The Way Home. Since June of 2018, the Lord has used this ministry to open some doors for my son and the circumstances surrounding his life, that seemed impossible to change. God has worked through this Godly ministry to be a blessing and encouragement to Brian, his wife, and son. We can't say enough about the Godly influence the caring folks at this ministry have been. We're so thankful that God, in His time, brought this work and our son's situation together. I recall when my wife returned from dropping Brian off at Transformed at The Way Home, she said "Things are going to be different. I just felt it the moment I met Bro. Terry. I felt the love, the concern. He told me this is not a Rehab or Treatment Center. This is a ministry, God has called me to this. They need a place to heal."

Sobriety, we know, is one day at a time, but by trusting in the Lord, and having a ministry like this, for God to work through, we know that more great things can be accomplished.

God Does Not Sleep

We continue to see our God do many mighty works and help those that truly want to be committed as disciples to grow in their relationship with God through Christ our Lord.

To date the ministry has served 34 men. Through follow ups we have made with some of them we are seeing over half of them continue to grow in faith and live free from drugs and alcohol. Many have restored relationships with families and children.

About a third of the men are still clean with some setbacks in their recovery but they have not let the setbacks defeat them. The remaining 20% we are praying and hoping they will find the freedom to live in Christ.

Our goal is that the men commit to staying 6 months and currently the average of all residents is 23 weeks just short of the 26-week commitment yet a definite testimony of God's work.

A State of War

During World War II men, women, and children all participated in the war effort. The war was won on the battlefield and by the workers at home. Collecting and recycling, building and repairing, volunteering for any number of needs.

This war, and it is a war with many causalities, against addiction needs many who will fight on the battlefield but many more who will engage in the efforts and volunteer to meet many needs such as prayer, helping with errands, making a meal, writing a letter.

A youth ministry recently wrote letters to the men expressing God's love to them. This is an example of how it takes many parts to be the body of Christ as scripture teaches.
